Language courses:

Erasmus+ students with knowledge of B2 Spanish or less are encouraged to participate in the intensive courses before starting their studies in Cordoba. The courses are free of charge and offered for two weeks in September-October (for first semester or full year students) and January-February (for second semester students). The venue is UCOIdiomas (University of Córdoba's Language center).
